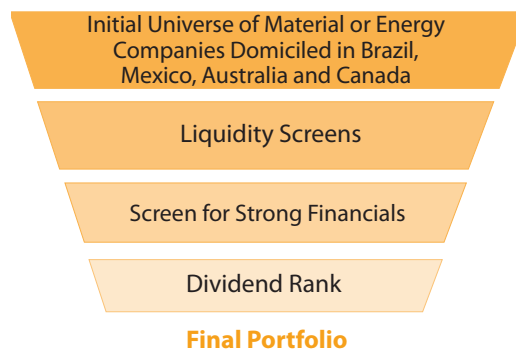
Investment Objective

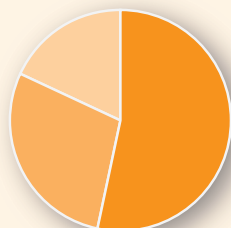
Security Selection
